Three Rank in the Top 5 in Total Tonnage in the U.S.:

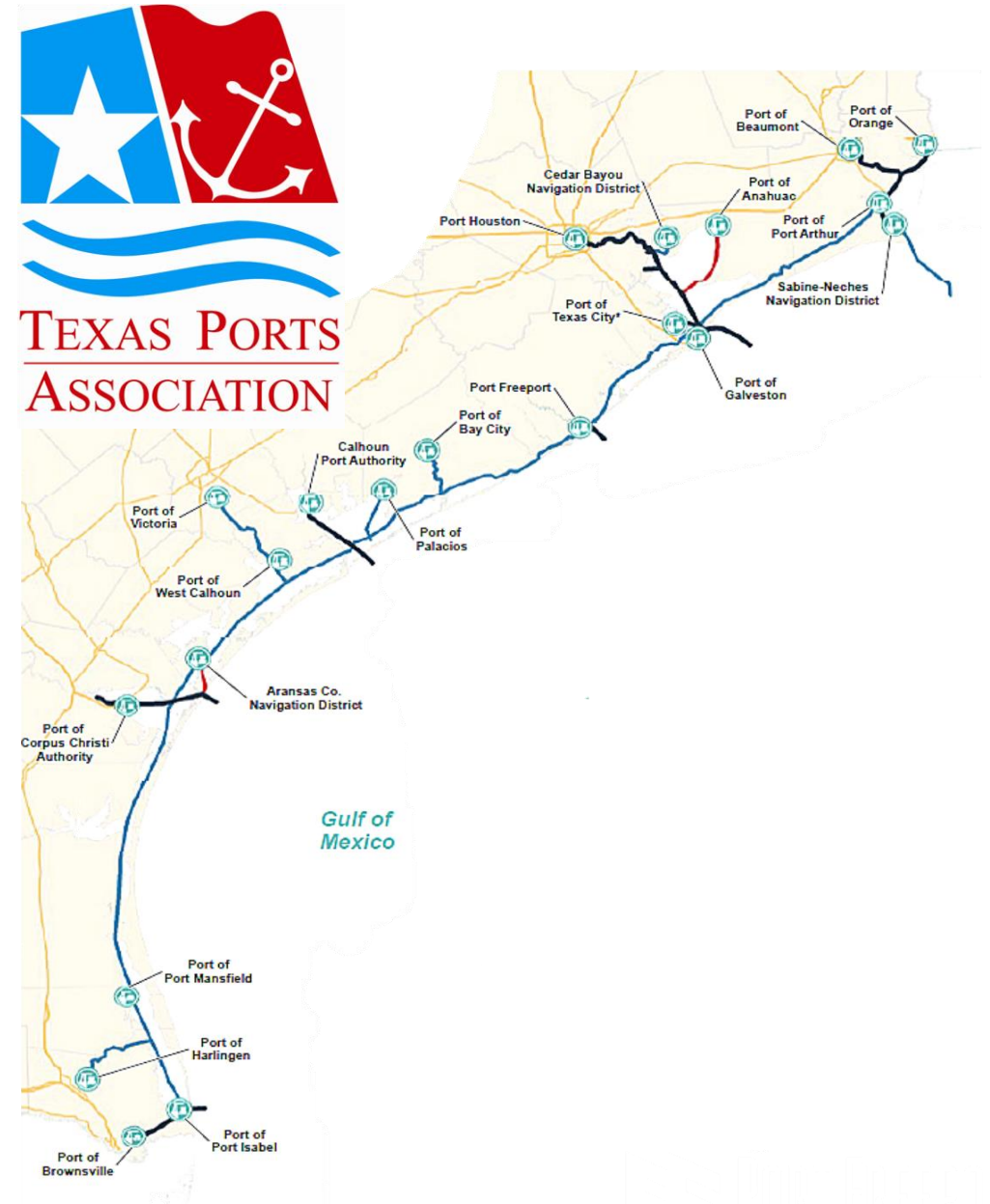

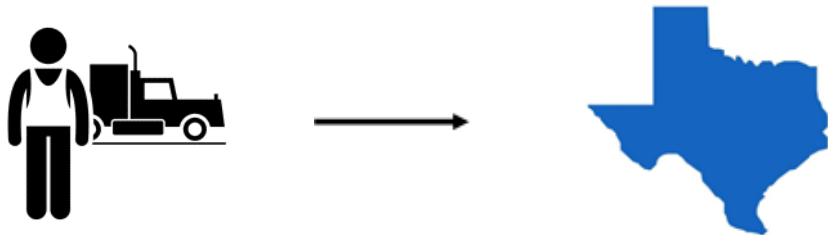
