



Texas Ports-Economic Impact*



National and State impact from 12 Texas ports:

- Total U.S. jobs—4.8 million
- Total U.S. economic value--\$1.093 trillion

6 Steps for Stakeholder Engagement



- Solicit input early
- 2. Explain the process
- Provide the content but not the conclusion
- 4. Include economic impact
- Assess risks and be transparent about available resources

TPA's Request to the Corps




- Incorporate the six keys to stakeholder success in processes
- Continuously improve:
 - Delegation of authority to SWD for 401c approval is good; but work to streamline process and approval time
 - 408 permits: expedite regional general permissions; identify instances where engineering submissions will be minimal, and streamline those processes
 - Seek early, informal comments from stakeholders to ease the drafting process for new or evolving policy
 - Support and promote policies which first consider the public

Continuous Improvement Challenge, continued



- Real Estate:
 - Help stakeholders understand solutions to problems
 - Identify options, and report the master plan for actions which can further industrial development
- Consider what best serves the public interest
- If it doesn't work, let's fix it as a team
