





#### **Southeast Texas Watersheds**








### **2015-2016 Activity**

- •2010-2014: Drought
- May 25-27, 2015 (Memorial Day Flood)
- October 31, 2015 (Halloween Flood)
- April 17-18, 2016 ("Tax Day" Flood)
- •May 26-27, 2016
- •2015-2016 Minor/Near Floods: April 2015, May 2015, TS Bill, October 2015, March 2016, April 2016 "Near Miss"

## Memorial Day Flood (2015)

- Widespread 7-17" rainfall over preceding month
- •6-hour rainfall: 8-10" in central, SW Harris County
- Record crests on Brays Bayou (Meyerland),
   Keegans Bayou
- •3,015 jurisdictional house counts
- 3,320 additional flood insurance claims
- Seven fatalities none in homes or businesses

# Memorial Day Flood (2015) Successes


- Flooding that DID NOT happen
- Brays Bayou: 1,200-1,400 homes flooded;
- ~2,000 did not
- •2.2B gallons of stormwater stored in excavated basins (3.5B gallon @ 1% design)
- Sims Bayou: 200+ homes did not flood
- •Sims Bayou: 1,000+ homes did not flood (Oct. 2015)

### "Tax Day" Flood (2016)

- More widespread than Memorial Day Flood
- •12-hour rainfall: 12-16" across northwest Harris County more in Waller County
- Cypress Creek naturally occurring overflow
- Addicks & Barker Reservoirs record levels
- Estimated 9,800+ homes and 2,700 apartment units flooded
- Nine fatalities none in homes or businesses

# "Tax Day" Flood (2016) Successes

- Coordination Addicks & Barker reservoirs, Buffalo Bayou
- Flooding that DID NOT happen
- Brays Bayou: ~1,500 homes flooded;
- ~1,500 did not
- •White Oak Bayou: ~2,200 homes flooded;
- ~2,200 did not (including 400 buyouts)
