

Buoy Procurement

All 50 buoys from last Contract received, with last shipment of 5 buoys delivered on 3 March 2016. Anticipate an additional 50 buoy purchase within the next 90-120 days

Buoy Re-Spacing

- Working with USACE Wilmington District marine crew (M/V Snell) to re-space and install buoys at 5 priority basins:
 BRFG, CRL, Pelican Island, Bolivar Peninsula and Port Arthur
- M/V Snell and crew to perform additional marine work within Galveston District boundaries
- Anticipate arrival during week of 15 August 2016

• Truston Buoy Repairs

- Original contract is in process of being modified to allow transport of 4 buoys to contractor's facility to start a forensic investigation
- After forensic investigation, Contractor and USACE will collectively determine a solution, design, and share in the cost for retrofitting the buoys such that they can be safely deployed





Mooring Buoy Update GIWW

- New Buoy Maintenance Service Contract
 - Award in May 2016 to Multiple Contractors (Blanket Purchase Agreement)
 - React faster to buoy needs
 - Provide for ability to address multiple basins concurrently
 - First priorities are basins at BRFG and CRL





Update on High Water Restrictions Brazos River Floodgates and Colorado River Locks

Brazos

- Off Restrictions as of 21 Jul
 - Started 19 Apr 93 days
 - Flow < 1.8 mph
 - Normal traffic 22 Jul

Colorado

- ► No Restrictions
 - Started 19 Apr
 - Stoppage 20-25 Apr
 - Normal traffic 02 May





Galveston Causeway Debris Removal

Goal: To provide safe navigation and adequate bottom width Partnering with TxDOT

- TxDOT funding
- USACE Contract
- Scope: Removal and demolition of structures associated with the Galveston Bridge Replacement
- After removal, next dredging Contract will establish the 125 foot bottom width
