
## David H. Mackintosh

David H. Mackintosh is the Chief of the Houston Project Office for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Galveston District, a position he assumed in April 2021.

A 13-year USACE veteran, Mr. Mackintosh currently oversees the operations and management of Addicks and Barker Reservoirs and the Wallisville Lake Project.

Prior to accepting his current position, Mr. Mackintosh served as the Lead Ranger at Addicks and Barker Reservoirs since May of 2017. During his tenure he spent his time engaging with the public regarding the inner workings of how the two normally dry reservoirs perform and their history as it relates to the development of the region.
