## U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS, GALVESTON DISTRICT

**PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE:** To inform you of a proposal for work in which you might be interested. It is also to solicit your comments and information to better enable us to make a reasonable decision on factors affecting the public interest. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) is not the entity proposing or performing the proposed work, nor has the Corps taken a position, in favor or against the proposed work.

**AUTHORITY:** This application will be reviewed pursuant to Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (CWA).

**LOCATION:** The project site is located in unnamed wetlands adjacent to Langham and Cypress Creek beginning at the intersection of Katy Hockley Road and House Hahl Road and extending northeast to the intersection of Cypress Creek and State Highway 99, in Cypress, Harris County, Texas.

## **LATITUDE & LONGITUDE (NAD 83):**

**Latitude:** 29.9194068° North; **Longitude:** -095.7908142° West

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The applicant proposes to permanently discharge fill material into 66.20 acres of palustrine emergent (PEM), palustrine forested (PFO), and palustrine scrub-shrub (PSS) wetland in association with the construction of a new residential development. The residential development will include the construction of houses, roadways, wastewater treatment, commercial spaces, and floodplain mitigation. No streams or ponds will be impacted by the proposed project.

**AVOIDANCE AND MINIMIZATION:** The applicant has stated that they have avoided and minimized the environmental impacts by designing the development avoiding impacts to 109 acres of aquatic features. These avoided features are composed of 5.35 acres of PEM, 77.36 acres of PSS, 22.02 acres of PFO, and 4.69 acres of palustrine, unconsolidated bottom, excavated water.

**MITIGATION:** The applicant proposes to provide compensatory mitigation for all permanent loss of aquatic resources. The compensation will be based on replacement of functions for all proposed impacts through the creation of a permittee responsible mitigation site located approximately 0.3 miles southwest of 27008 Sharp Road, in Katy, Harris County, Texas. The proposed mitigation plan is attached in 6 sheets.

**CURRENT SITE CONDITIONS:** The project site is currently an undeveloped tract of land surrounded by agricultural and residential areas to the north, south, east, and west. The project site receives regularly mowing, allowing mainly herbaceous vegetation to grow. The subject wetlands are adjacent to Cypress and Langham Creek.

**NOTES:** This public notice is being issued based on information furnished by the applicant. This project information has not been verified by the Corps. The applicant's plans are enclosed in 12 sheets.

A preliminary review of this application indicates that an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is not required. Since permit assessment is a continuing process, this preliminary determination of EIS requirement will be changed if data or information brought forth in the coordination process is of a significant nature.

Our evaluation will also follow the guidelines published by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency pursuant to Section 404 (b)(1) of the CWA.

## **OTHER AGENCY AUTHORIZATIONS:**

The proposed project will trigger review under Section 401 of the Clean Water Act (CWA). The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) will review this application under Section 401 of the CWA and in accordance with Title 30, Texas Administrative Code Section 279.1-13 to determine if the work would comply with State water quality standards. The applicant contacted the TCEQ and initiated the Section 401 CWA process, on 8 November 2024. **NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES:** The staff archaeologist has reviewed the latest published version of the National Register of Historic Places, lists of properties determined eligible, and other sources of information. The following is current knowledge of the presence or absence of historic properties and the effects of the undertaking upon these properties:

The permit area is likely to contain terrestrial cultural resources that could be eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. The applicant will need to investigate for historic properties.

**THREATENED AND ENDANGERED:** Threatened and/or endangered species or their critical habitat may be affected by the proposed work. Consultation with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife and/or the National Marine Fisheries Service will be initiated to assess the effect on endangered species.

PUBLIC INTEREST REVIEW FACTORS: This application will be reviewed in accordance with 33 CFR 320-332, the Regulatory Programs of the Corps, and other pertinent laws, regulations and executive orders. The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impacts, including cumulative impacts, of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefits, which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the proposal, must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors, which may be relevant to the proposal, will be considered: among conservation, economics. those are general environmental concerns, wetlands, historic properties, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, floodplain values, land use, navigation, shore erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food and fiber production, mineral needs and, in general, the needs and welfare of the people.

**SOLICITATION OF COMMENTS:** The Corps is soliciting comments from the public, Federal, State, and local agencies and officials, Indian tribes, and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this proposed activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps to determine whether to issue, modify, condition or deny a permit for this proposal. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Impact Assessment and/or an EIS pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the proposed activity.

This public notice is being distributed to all known interested persons in order to assist in developing facts upon which a decision by the Corps may be based. For accuracy and completeness of the record, all data in support of or in opposition to the proposed work should be submitted in writing setting forth sufficient detail to furnish a clear understanding of the reasons for support or opposition.

**PUBLIC HEARING:** The purpose of a public hearing is to solicit additional information to assist in the evaluation of the proposed project. Prior to the close of the comment period, any person may make a written request for a public hearing, setting forth the particular reasons for the request. The District Engineer will determine if the reasons identified for holding a public hearing are sufficient to warrant that a public hearing be held. If a public hearing is warranted, all known interested persons will be notified of the time, date, and location.

CLOSE OF COMMENT PERIOD: All comments pertaining to this public notice must reach this office on or before 24 February 2025. Extensions of the comment period may be granted for valid reasons provided a written request is received by the limiting date. If no comments are received by that date, it will be considered that there are no objections.
